FSC POL-01 -

Appointment to the Advisory Committee:

Any child and family-serving organization in Nevada may apply to join the Foster Change Advisory Committee. The organization must:

- 1) Believe and support the mission of Foster Change
- 2) Agree to be in adherence with the Foster Change Bylaws
- 3) Submit a completed application along with a recommendation by the organization's local county child welfare agency.
- 4) Be approved and appointed by the Foster Change Board of Directors

FCPOL-02 -

Advisory Committee Organizational Grant Requests:

If at any time Foster Change has funding to award grant requests, any organization serving on the Foster Change Advisory Committee, in good standing, may apply to receive a grant, for the use of furthering their service to children experiencing foster care.

These grant requests will be offered, received, reviewed and awarded by majority vote from the DFS Executive Events Planning Committee.

These funds are not guaranteed at any time and will only be offered when available.

Foster Change Appendix Manual **Updated 5.22.2024**

Just Cause - Just cause refers to a violation of a bylaw or policy. In some cases, an individual or organization may commit an act that is not specifically addressed within the Foster Change bylaws or policies but one of which the Board of Directors believes warrants discipline or discharge.

Good Moral Character - "Good moral character" includes but is not limited to qualities of honesty, fairness, candor, trustworthiness, observance of fiduciary responsibility, respect for and obedience to the law, and respect for the rights of others and the judicial process.

Ethical Good Standing - Good standing, as expressed here, is defined as "to be in favor with, or be on good terms with the local child welfare agency, there being no disputes or investigations, either ongoing, pending or substantiated, and to hold respected influence or status in the child and family serving field.
